

MARSHALL COUNTY BOARD MEETING

September 18th, 2025

The Marshall County Board met for the September Board meeting on September 18th, 2025; at 8:30 A.M. Acting Chairperson Travis McGlasson called the meeting to order. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call shows: McGlasson, Lindstrom, Minnick, McLaughlin, Lueders, Fecht, Balensiefen, Meierkord, Durham, Perona, and Stash was present. 1 absent.

#25-51 It was moved by McLaughlin and seconded by Balensiefen to **approve** and accept the resignation of Henry Gauwitz from County Board District 3 and Chairperson.

Vote Shows: all ayes, 0 nays and 1 absent.

Vice-Chairperson McGlasson wanted to thank Hank for all he has done in the past 15 years as a board member. He was involved in a lot and put a lot of time and effort into it.

County Clerk & Recorder Jill Kenyon called for a nomination for a Chairperson effective September 18, 2025.

#25-52 It was moved by Lindstrom and seconded by Meierkord to **appoint** Travis McGlasson as County Board Chairperson effective September 18, 2025.

Vote Shows: all ayes, 0 nays and 1 vacant.

Chairperson McGlasson called for a nomination for Vice-Chairperson effective September 18, 2025.

#25-53 It was moved by McLaughlin and seconded by Meierkord to **appoint** Brad Lindstrom as County Board Vice-Chairperson effective September 18, 2025.

Health Department update was given. Hector Gomez was present. He stated it is flu season. They will be having a flu clinic at the United Methodist Church on October 9th 8:30am-9:30am. They have a new lab company they are working with, and it is cheaper for self-paid individuals.

Zoning:

Ryan Giacometti gave an update. He stated that they had 2 hearings on August 21st. One being for a text amendment for an alteration for an existing cell tower and fees and the other being to install a temporary meteorological tower on Turnbull property from Apex Clean Energy. The Zoning Administration also is requesting John Murphy be re-appointed for a 5-year term. They are also asking for funds for a parcel that is in violation of the zoning ordinance which will be used for a bid from Senica Towing. A list of building permits was given to each member.

(The demolition will only be for vehicles not buildings.)

Highway:

County Engineer Catherine Terando gave an update. She stated that seal crack work is finished. The maintainers are spray patching, mowing and doing routine maintenance on the vehicles. 27 bridge inspections were conducted in August. 550N in LaPrairie will be shut down to one lane after finding a critical issue.

Animal Control: Meierkord stated that the Animal Control person had a medical event happen and he checked with Dr. McCully, and the dogs are being taken care of. There are currently 3 at the pound.

Building & Grounds: Meierkord thanked County Clerk & Recorder Jill Kenyon for getting a grant to re-seal the parking lot. ESCO has been here and testing the new boiler system. The tree has been cut down. McMahan will be reseeding and aerating the yard.

Coroner/Sheriff: Sheriff Strawn stated that all the community events went smoothly. One of the deputies had to have an MRI done and everything checked out well. They currently have 3 deputies that are certified through a new drone program they introduced. Jail inspection was completed. They have had a lot of prisoners.

EMA: Director Rich Koch is attending an active shooter training course, and the next meeting will be October 8th.

Finance/Budget: Chairperson McGlasson stated that he will be the Chairperson for this committee.

County Highway & Recycling: Lindstrom stated they may have to look at options for the parking lot, so the salt doesn't damage it.

Human Resources & IT: Nothing to report.

Lower & Upper Offices: Meierkord stated Circuit Clerk Gina Noe is seeing if she can cover the monthly maintenance for the elevator on a grant that she has applied for.
